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1. A Successful Start in the District of Esslingen – About this pamphlet



Moving to another country comes with a lot of hurdles and lots of uncertainty – especially if you are responsible for one or more children.

This pamphlet is intended to help you find your way in Germany and to give you as a parent information on where to go for advice and support. You can then give your child the best possible support and also get a better understanding of what your child, and you as a parent, can expect.

However, as the wide range of services presented in this pamphlet show, you are far from alone on this journey. To help you get the best possible start in Germany, there are a number of full-time and volunteer professionals out there who can offer you advice on any questions you might have about education and parenting.

The following chapters will give you information on the different structures, institutions and projects on offer in the regions around the District of Esslingen and will help you with the daily job of being a parent in Germany.

2. Support structures & services for parents in the District of Esslingen



This chapter contains information on the different services that you and your family can benefit from in the District of Esslingen.

It starts with an overview of where to get advice in the District itself, followed by a list of family education centres, projects in individual communities and other useful points of contact for questions about **education**, **parenting** and **family life**.



2.1 Advice and support services in the region

Parents and children who have questions or encounter problems can contact one of the many **advice centres** in the region. These advice centres are located in Esslingen, Filderstadt, Kirchheim, Leinfelden-Echterdingen or Nürtingen.

Their services are **free**.

ProjuFa – Early-stage help and advice

The birth of a child changes everything. Everyday life with a small child is a joy, but it also places certain strains on parents and families. Early experiences are particularly important in the development of your child.

ProjuFa helps young families through pregnancy and infancy up until the child's third birthday.

ProjuFa works with you to find ways of helping you manage tough parenting situations with your child better.

What does ProjuFa offer?

- A point of contact that you can turn to with questions and concerns relating to children and family life
- Family midwives, specialists in family care, healthcare and childcare, or experts from social services and psychology who can offer you advice, help and practical support – including at your home
- "Parent meet-ups" and parent courses which you can join to talk to other parents, get information on a range of topics and to provide you strength and support when it comes to raising your child

Mental health counselling centres



The regional mental health counselling centres (Psychologische Beratungsstellen, or PBS for short) act as points of contact for parents, children, young people, dedicated volunteers and teaching professionals.

These centres can help with:

- parenting and family issues
- family conflicts and crises (e.g. couples counselling, separation, violence)
- children's developmental issues
- problems at kindergarten, in school or on training schemes (e.g. aggression, bullying, difficulties building relationships, problems integrating)
- difficulties such as problems concentrating, anxieties, trouble sleeping or headaches
- performance or behavioural issues
- stresses and strains after particularly bad experiences
- suicidal crises

The counselling centres can also bring in **interpreters** to make it easier to talk about certain subjects, even if your German is not perfect.

Social Services and parenting help centres

Social Services are the first point of contact for helping young people and managing other social issues for people looking for help and advice.

They can help with parenting, family, social and personal difficulties, and in times of crisis. **Social Services** are organised into **eleven local parenting help centres** across the region, in cooperation with independent providers of youth welfare. The 22 counselling centres are aimed in particular at families with children aged 14 and under, offering them easily accessible, flexible help with everyday parenting issues.

The State Schools Office provides migrant children and young migrants aged 15 and under (and their parents) with advice and support on **schooling** and **language acquisition**.





Mental health counselling centre for schools at the Centre for School Quality and Teacher Training (ZSL)



This mental health counselling centre is a **specialist psychological service** and provides support to everyone involved in school life:

Children in school and their parents/guardians, teachers, (deputy) headteachers and anyone else who works in and with schools.

Advice is **free, voluntary** and **confidential**.

Children in school and their parents can get advice on:

- Performance issues
- Difficulties learning and working
- Problems with concentration
- Problems with motivation
- Relationship issues at school
- Abnormal behaviour at school
- Children who are worried about school or refusing to go to school
- Questions about the school system

2.5 Family education, parent and mentor projects in the District of Esslingen

The District of Esslingen has a whole range of different services available for parents with and without a migrant background. There are also often a number of different ways you can benefit from these services.

For example, there are **courses** you can attend with other parents to learn about caring for your baby or the German school system, or alternatively you can find opportunities to have a volunteer who speaks the same **native language** as you to **accompany** you to parents' evenings at your child's kindergarten or school.

Often, all you need to do to take advantage of these services is to get in touch with the institution or contact person.

There, you can find out whether the service is free or if you will have to pay a fee.

Who is the service aimed at?

The Rucksack-Programm is aimed at parents of children aged 4-6 and children in primary school Grades 1 and 2.

Who are we and what do we do:

Rucksack is a language learning and parent education project designed specially for families with a migrant background. Our aim is to provide parents and children with general language teaching and to promote the German language, and also to strengthen people's native languages as a foundation for their second language and to provide contacts, support, community and dialogue in a familiar environment. There is also a big focus on networking with KiTas and schools. Our parent meet-ups are held every week in a childcare centre or school and run for around 1.5 hours. Here, parents get a weekly programme run by our trained parents' assistant who will give you inspiration for activities you can do with your kids at home in your family's language, with a new activity every day.

Who is the service aimed at?

We are aimed at mums with a migrant background.

Who are we and what do we do:

The project is aimed at mums with a migrant background and is held at four different locations in Esslingen. The project aims to empower mums in their parenting role and to encourage them to get involved in the local community. Across the course units, we give teach them about life in Esslingen and education and leisure activities.

Who is the service aimed at?

We help and support families with at least one child under the age of three.

Who are we and what do we do:

As part of our early help scheme, our mentors are generally responsible for all families with children under three years of age who need temporary support to help relieve some of the strain. Our mentors initiative is intended to be preventative and their help should be sought before real problems emerge. Our volunteer mentors can provide families who are interested with a maximum of four hours of support a week over a period of at least half a year, completely free of charge. They "help people help themselves" and provide breathing space, mostly by looking after the children, so that the family can reorganise and identify its strengths and opportunities.

Chancenschenker aims to support children in the District of Esslingen with the help of volunteer mentors. Our mentors can take care of your child for around 1-2 hours once a week. Our volunteer guides help refugees in Esslingen, giving them support in areas such as learning German, leisure time and daily routines, getting to know the neighbours and meeting people at local organisations, guiding them through legal processes with local authorities, and much more.

Who is the service aimed at?

We are aimed at families with primary school-age children, i.e. children aged 6-10.

Who are we and what do we do:

Our project was founded by a community mentor in close collaboration with the city's civic engagement coordination centre (KoBE) and assigns a mentor with good knowledge of German to your child. Language skills and schooling are essential for successful integration. And with a mentor for school, children get individual support and guidance from a volunteer in addition to the support offered by the schools themselves. Each mentor focuses on one little brother or sister, establishing committed and reliable relationships. They do this by meeting up with their little brother or sister for one to two hours a week, generally at school. These meetings are tailored to the needs of each child. German language is initially practised with games and fun activities. Later, your child may also need occasional help with homework or they might arrange leisure activities together with their mentor.

3. Financial support for children in school

3.1 Education and Participation services (BuT)

Children and young people from families receiving Unemployment benefits II (Arbeitslosengeld II), Social benefits (Sozialgeld), Social assistance (Sozialhilfe), Child benefits (Kinderzuschlag) or a Living allowance (Wohngeld) are entitled to claim benefits from the Education and Participation package. This financial support is intended to enable all children to participate **in school, social and cultural life**. Support is available for school excursions and class trips, school supplies, transport to and from school, learning support, lunch fees, and social and cultural participation, such as club memberships or costs for music lessons. The support available through the "Education and Participation Package" can be applied for from the **relevant agency**, that is, the place that is supporting you financially. You can find information on this on the District Administration website under the section Education and Participation (Bildung und Teilhabe).

3.2 Federal Training Assistance Act (BAföG)

Trainees attending schools and colleges can receive financial support, referred to in German by its abbreviation **BAföG**, for their training or studies.

BAföG for children in school: Requirements

- Pupils attending Grade 10 or higher
- Trainees at evening high schools, colleges, vocational schools, academies etc.

Many foreigners are entitled to claim BAföG, not just German citizens. According to the policy, persons are entitled to financial support if they have good prospects of remaining **in Germany and** have already integrated into society.

Generally speaking, BAföG is means-tested, i.e. it depends on a family's income. Pupils in school receive BAföG as a **full grant**, Meaning that they do not have to pay any of it back. More information is available at

4. Language learning and multi-lingualism

You are probably wondering not just how you will learn the local language, but how your child or children will also manage to learn **German**. After all, it's quite important to speak German in order to attend school here. The following chapters will tell you about the support structures that are available during your child's time at school to ensure that you child learns to also speak their native language **or** mother tongue **well, in addition to learning good German**.




4.1 Preparatory classes (VKL)

Preparatory classes (often referred to in German by the abbreviation VKL) are for children with little to no knowledge of German. This means that children are first given **intensive** German language teaching. This ensures that later on they are able to understand their lessons, teachers and classmates properly. While they transition, children can also start by attending normal classes for a few hours at a time so that they can learn subjects like maths or music with the other children. The advantage of a preparatory class is that it provides **focused teaching** in the German language with plenty of exercises. After they move into normal classes, i.e. learning together with German-speaking classmates, children can continue attending preparatory classes in German language for a few hours a week.

4.2 Fostering multi-lingualism

Almost all school subjects are taught in German. This is why there used to be an expectation that parents would speak German at home with their children. That is not the case anymore. Nowadays, we know from many scientific studies that the **better** we speak our so-called native language, the better we can learn new languages. This means that as a parent, the best way to help your child is to speak with them in the language (or languages) that you yourself speak the best. While families can help to support this language learning process, multi-lingualism can also be fostered in the classroom (see next page). After all, the better a child speaks the **first language** they learn, the better they can learn a second or third language, like German. Plus, multi-lingualism is a valuable **skill** which can be very useful for work and also enriches people personally.

Your child can start learning and practising German outside of the family environment, such as with friends, at kindergarten, in school, at clubs or when doing other activities. You can also talk about this subject with other **multi-lingual parents** at the various parent meet-ups (see Chapter 2.5 above). 4.3 Native-language learning

Certain consulates in Baden-Württemberg offer so-called native-language external teaching so that people can learn their first language better or make sure they do not forget it. These classes are generally held **in addition** to regular teaching. In these classes, you will also learn how to **write** in this language. The consulates and embassies offer language classes in Turkish, Greek and Italian at schools in the District of Esslingen, while some schools also offer Albanian, Croatian, Portuguese and Spanish.

For more information, please ask at your child's school whether they offer native-language external teaching. Children can then sign up directly with the relevant teacher or you can get an application form from the School Secretariat if teaching is offered at a separate school. If you would like to know which schools in your area offers these lessons, you can contact the State Schools Office in Nürtingen (see p. 20).



5. Useful information from the District Administration

The schools entrance test – explained in multiple languages

Before children start school, they are examined by the **Health Office**. This examination is called the schools entrance test (or Einschulungsuntersuchung in German). All children must undergo this examination. It is made up of two parts.


