

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1. School education

In Germany, you should provide proof of your formal schooling. You can either have any schooling you have already completed recognised in Germany, or you can acquire a German school-leaving certificate.

Getting your schooling recognised

If you have a school-leaving certificate issued in a different country, you can have this certificate recognised by the **Certification Recognition Centre (Zeugnisenerkennungsstelle)** at the Regional Council (Regierungspräsidium) Stuttgart. You will find the application form and the fee waiver form on the Council's website.

Getting your schooling recognised in order to apply for further education

Want to enter further education and already have a school-leaving certificate from a different country? Then you need what's called a university entrance qualification (Hochschulzugangsberechtigung). If your overseas diploma is not sufficient for you to start studying in Germany right away, you can attend a preparatory college (Studienkolleg) at a German college or university. This course generally takes one year and ends with a so-called assessment test (Feststellungsprüfung). Students who pass this test can study subjects that correspond to the subject area their preparatory course focused on anywhere in Germany. Your selected college or university will tell you how to get a university entrance qualification and what the requirements are for your selected course. Chapters 6 and 7 contain information on where to go for advice and support in Esslingen and Stuttgart.




Attending school in Germany

Children and young people under the age of 18 who have not yet graduated from school must attend school or vocational education. New arrivals can continue attending vocational schooling until their 20th birthday.

Children and young people under 15 years of age

Schools offer preparatory classes (Vorbereitungsklassen or VKL for short) for children and young people under the age of 15 who speak little or no German.

These classes teach them the German language before they join regular classes. If their selected school does not offer preparatory classes, then in some cases children can go straight into regular classes. If a child or young person already speaks sufficient German, they can also join regular classes straight away.



Registration

Primary schools for children aged 10 and under are divided into catchment areas. Children must be registered at the primary school in the catchment area where they live.

If this primary school does not have any preparatory classes, then you must apply for a school transfer so that your child can move to a primary school which does offer preparatory classes.

Children aged 10-15 can apply directly to their selected school. Only your selected school gets to decide whether or not to admit your child.

If you have any questions, you can contact the State Schools Office (Staatliches Schulamt) in Nürtingen. The staff there can talk to you about education opportunities.

Children and young people aged 15 to 21 years old

VABO

In Esslingen, young adults aged 15 to 21 years old who have no or limited knowledge of Germany generally attend a Pre-Qualification Year for Work/Vocation without Knowledge of German (Vorqualifizierungsjahr Arbeit/Beruf ohne Deutschkenntnisse or VABO for short) at vocational colleges.

VABO classes for young people focus primarily on the German language.

Registering for VABO

To sign up for a VABO course, you must complete the application on the Käthe-Kollwitz-Schule website. The Käthe-Kollwitz-Schule is in charge of allocating young adults to the various VABO classes offered in the district of Esslingen. If there are no free spaces available when applying, you will initially be placed on the waiting list.


VAB and AVdual

Young people and young adults with at least A2-level German are admitted to the Pre-Qualification Year for Work/Vocation (Vorqualifizierungsjahr Arbeit/Beruf or VAB for short) or Dual Preparation Course for Education (Duale Ausbildungsvorbereitung or AVdual for short). Both of these courses offer vocational guidance alongside subject-specific teaching. Students can obtain a high-school diploma (Hauptschulabschluss) by passing certain additional exams.

What's special about the AVdual is that young people and young adults are taught according to their speed and level of learning. Students can also learn about professions and occupations by integrating practical placements into their learning. The AVdual support scheme (AVdual-Begleitung) offers students lots of practical help with finding, preparing for and attending placements.

Registering for VAB and AVdual

Students sign up for VAB and AVdual directly with their selected vocational college. You will find an overview of all the vocational colleges in the area on pages 17 and 18.



2. Vocational training

In Germany, you generally need to complete vocational training before you can take up a vocation or profession. There are two different types of vocational training: practical training and classroom training.

For new arrivals who are interested in vocational training, it is a good idea to get advice from the Agency for Work (Agentur für Arbeit) if your language is level B1 and up.

Practical training (placements)

Practical, and also dual, training is made up of two parts: one part of your training takes place in a practical setting, while the other part takes place at a vocational college. The company where students do their placement takes care of the practical side of your training, while the vocational college teaches them theoretical knowledge.

Dual training generally lasts between two and three-and-a-half years. The first step is for the company and the trainee to draw up a training contract. The company then takes care of registering the trainee with a vocational college.

Requirements

a) Persons with permission to remain (Aufenthaltsgestattung)

You must obtain **approval for an apprenticeship from the migration authorities**. This approval may be subject to certain conditions, such as residence in Germany for at least 3 months.

Persons from safe countries of origin who have submitted their asylum application after 31/08/2015 may not take up training or education.

b) Persons with temporary suspension of deportation (Duldung)

You must obtain approval for an apprenticeship.

This approval can be issued by the immigration authorities under instruction from the Regional Council of Karlsruhe subject to certain conditions.

Anyone who was already employed at the time when their first „Duldung“ was issued, shall initially be permitted to continue their employment for the duration of this first „Duldung“ subject to fulfilment of the grounds for exemption under Sec. 60a(6)(2) German Residence Act (AufenthG) (deportation not possible due to lack of cooperation). Upon the granting of this first extension, it will be reviewed whether the foreigner is complying with his or her obligations to cooperate on obtaining a passport. If this is not the case, employment (training) will no longer be permitted.

Persons from safe countries of origin who have submitted their asylum application after 31/08/2015 and persons with who are not permitted to work according to foreign law may not take up training or education.

c) Persons with a temporary residence permit
Special approval for training or education is not required from the immigration authorities if the applicant's temporary residence permit permits them to take up employment. In all other cases, approval by the migration authorities is required.

Classroom training

In addition to practical training and placements, you can also attend classroom training. Vocational training in a classroom means that your practical and theoretical teaching both take place in a school. This teaching is supplemented by placements. Training lasts between two and three years. Teaching for technical assistant professions and lots of healthcare professions is only offered as classroom training. Vocational training in a classroom takes place at vocational schools and colleges.

Requirements

To be admitted to classroom training, you must have very good knowledge of German and at least a school-leaving certificate or diploma. Students sign up for classroom training directly with the vocational college.

4. Other ways into work



The options described above are not the only ways to get further vocational training or to find employment. For example, any existing training you have can be recognised (in parts) and supplemented with a later qualification. Alternatively, you can attend vocational language courses or find out what it's like to work in a certain profession by taking up placements etc. The Job Centre and the Agency for Work run a range of initiatives for entering the job market.

Getting your vocational training recognised

The IQ-Netzwerk in Stuttgart offers advice on how to get existing vocational qualifications recognised, and how to gain further qualifications and adapt to the German job market. See page 38 for the consultation hours at IQ-Netzwerk in Esslingen.

Financial support is available for getting your qualifications recognised. You can apply for grants to cover the costs of the process of getting overseas qualifications recognised. Funding is available for costs such as fees and translation costs.

Language qualifications

Building on the general integration courses, vocational language courses are also offered in the region as a way of making it easier to enter the job market.

Vocational Language Training (DeuFöV)

Target group

Who can attend these courses?

-You must be a registered job-seeker (arbeitsuchend) and/or generally receiving benefits according to the German Social Code, either SGB II (Hartz IV benefits) or SGB III (Arbeitslosengeld/Unemployment benefits); You are seeking training or education, are already in training or education, or are currently in the process of getting your vocational or professional training recognised.

Requirements

You must also be one of the following:

- An immigrant, including refugees, who is currently applying for recognition of their qualifications and has good prospects for remaining in the country (the latter currently applies to the countries of origin of Syria and Eritrea). This does not include refugees from safe countries of origin
- A citizen of the EU
- German with migrant heritage

You have already completed an integration course and/or already speak German at B1, B2 or C1 level according to the Common European Framework.

The employment agencies and Job Centre decide who can attend vocational language courses. Please talk to your advisor about this.

You can still attend vocational language courses even if you are already employed, as long as you do not yet have sufficient language skills to manage your (future) day-to-day responsibilities at work. If your taxable annual income is less than €20,000, you will receive financial support for 50% of the costs of the course per teaching unit. This financial support can also be provided by your employer.

Structure

The course is made up of between 300 and 600 teaching units. Full-time and part-time courses are available. The course ends with an exam.

Shadowing, placements and entry qualifications

In principle, you can learn what it's like to work in a certain profession by shadowing, doing a placement or gaining entry-level qualifications (Einstiegsqualifizierungen or EQ for short). You can also combine an entry qualification course with a language course.

Initiatives from the Job Centre and Agency for Work

The Job Centre and the Agency for Work offer a number of different initiatives for integrating into the world of work and training. Both institutions work to place the people they look after on the scheme that's right for them, offering them advice and support throughout. Newly acquired skills and knowledge is then applied in order to integrate into the job market.

For help and advice, get in touch with your contact at the Agency for Work or the Job Centre.

5. Financing opportunities during training

Recognised refugees have access to all (financial) funding opportunities for work, training and qualifications as long as they meet the individual funding requirements. Special rules apply to asylum seekers and persons with a temporary suspension of deportation (Duldung). Information on these rules is available from the Agency for Work or the Job Centre.

Education and Participation/Bildung und Teilhabe (BuT)

Children and young people from families receiving Unemployment benefits II (Arbeitslosengeld II), Social benefits (Sozialgeld), Social assistance (Sozialhilfe), Child benefits (Kinderzuschlag) or a Living allowance (Wohngeld) are entitled to claim benefits from the Education and Participation package. This financial support is intended to enable all children to **participate** in school, social and cultural life. Support is available for school excursions and class trips, school supplies, transport to and from school, learning support, lunch fees, and social and cultural participation, such as club memberships or costs for music lessons. The support available through the "Education and Participation Package" can be applied for from the relevant **agency**, that is, the place that is supporting you financially. You can find information on this on the District Administration website under the section Education and Participation (Bildung und Teilhabe).

Financial Assistance with Vocational Training

Financial Assistance with Vocational Training (Berufsausbildungsbeihilfe or BAB for short) is available from the Agency for Work for the duration of a nationally recognised vocational training placement. Trainees above the age of 18 can receive BAB as long as they are not living with their parents during their training and they cannot obtain the funds needed for their training through other means.

Trainees under the age of 18 can only receive BAB support if:

- a) the training centre cannot be reached from their parents' home within a reasonable amount of time;
- or
- b) they are married; or
- c) they live with a child; or
- d) they cannot remain in their parents' house for social reasons.



Germany Federal Training Assistance Act (BAföG)

Trainees attending schools and colleges can receive financial support, referred to in German by its abbreviation **BAföG**, for their training or studies.

BAföG for children in school: Requirements

- Pupils attending Grade 10 or higher
- Trainees at evening high schools, colleges, vocational schools, academies etc.

Many foreigners are entitled to claim BAföG, not just German citizens. According to the policy, persons are entitled to financial support if they have **good prospects of remaining** in Germany and have already integrated into society.

Generally speaking, BAföG is means-tested, i.e. it depends on a family's income. Pupils in school receive BAföG as a **full grant**, meaning that they do not have to pay any of it back.

Youth Migration Service in Esslingen

Target group

The Youth Migration Service (Jugendmigrationsdienst) is aimed at young people and young adults with migrant heritage (migrants and foreigners) aged between 12 and 27 years of age, in particular those who have recently arrived in the country and are no longer required to attend school. The funding scheme is based on the Federal Government's Children and Young People Plan.

What they offer

The Internationaler Bund provides advice and support, including individual integration support for young new arrivals, advice and support for all young people with migrant heritage experiencing crises, advice and support for parents on schooling, training and education for their children, group activities (including with young people born in Germany), and cooperation on integration in local networks.

Target group

The Welcome Service Region Stuttgart (WSRS) provided by Wirtschaftsförderung Region Stuttgart GmbH offers **regular consultation hours** in Esslingen and the Esslingen district, in cooperation with the City of Esslingen. **Their free job application coaching** and **consultation hours** are aimed at international professionals and their family, and students who want to live and work in Esslingen or who have recently moved to Esslingen and need help and support.

What they offer

The advisors at WSRS offer appointments in German, English and Chinese: they can give you introductory information on any questions you might have about coming to, living and working in Esslingen and, depending on what you need, can direct you to special institutions such as the Agency for Work, Qualification Verification Centres or professional chambers.

Areas where they can assist you include learning German, looking for work, getting overseas school diplomas and professional qualifications recognised, residency, education, studying and living.
